HOW DO WE GET THERE?

FROM WEST AREA

Northwest area via Ohio Turnpike (I-80) to PA Turnpike (I-76 East) to Irwin (Exit 7) on PA Turnpike. Take Route 30 East 11 to 12 miles to Westmoreland Mall. Turn left at light, go up hill to Four Points Hotel.

FROM SOUTHWESTERN AREA

Take I-70 East to New Stanton. Take US 119 North to US 30 East by-pass at Greensburg. Go about three miles east on US 30 to Westmoreland Mall. Turn left at light, go up hill to Four Points Hotel.

FROM CENTRAL WESTERN AREA

Take US 30 to Parkway West (I-279) into Pittsburgh where I-279 changes to I-376. Proceed east on I-376 to Monroeville interchange (Exit 6) on PA Turnpike. Continue east on PA Turnpike to Irwin interchange (Exit 7). Get off here and follow US 30 East to Westmoreland Mall. Turn left at light, go up hill to Four Points Hotel.

FROM NORTHERN AREA

Take I-79 South to Exit 3 on PA Turnpike. Get on PA Turnpike and go east to Irwin interchange (Exit 7). Take Route 30 East 11 to 12 miles to Westmoreland Mall. Turn left at light, go up hill to Four Points Hotel.

FROM EAST CENTRAL AREA

Take I-80 to I-81 interchange. Follow I-81 South to Carlisle interchange on PA Turnpike. Go west on PA Turnpike to New Stanton (Exit 8). Take US 119 North to US 30 East by-pass at Greensburg. Follow US 30 East a few miles to Westmoreland Mall. Turn left at light, go up hill to Four Points Hotel.

FROM SOUTHEASTERN AREA

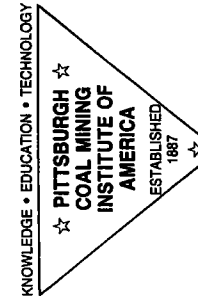
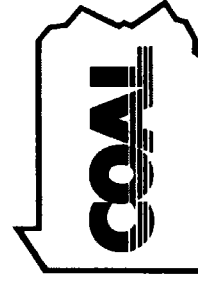
